### St Andrew's Amblers Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> November Reddish Vale

Our November walk remains close to home taking us on a surprisingly pleasant walk in the area between Reddish and Denton. Woodland, riverside trails and canal towpaths dominate this walk, which includes stretches of the Trans Pennine Trail, Tameside Trail and Peak Forest Canal and visits Reddish Vale Country Park en route. The terrain we traverse is woodland, canal and field paths, cobbled roads and tarmac, mostly on the level. Castle Hill as the name implies requires a bit more effort, but it is on tarmac. We do have to walk through an industrial area but this should not detract from the natural variety of this walk. It is about 6½ miles in length and will almost certainly be muddy in places so it's essential to wear walking boots and to bring a walking pole to use as a depth gauge. Bring refreshments for a break and your binoculars if you are interested in birds. We meet at St Andrew's Car Park for a punctual start at 9:30am and should be finished by 1:30pm, at the latest, for a spot of lunch at the Fletchers Arms on Stockport Road, Denton, where we hope to start the walk. In the event of inclement weather the walk can be shortened considerably. For further information contact Mike Hewson


