St Andrew's Amblers - Saturday June 8th 2019

This is a relatively easy short walk of about 4.5 miles around Whaley Moor to the east of Lyme Park. However, it is not a trivial walk, having a number of climbs and descents – but none of them are severe or long.

We park in a layby on Mudhurst Lane near the High Peak school (the old Moorlands Hotel). Once past the school we climb the shoulder of Whaley Moor and then walk on a contour past the "Dipping Stone" and down to Whaley Lane. We then shortly veer right over Hawkhurst Head and round to New House Farm to follow the track passing Cornhill Farm, Bailey's Farm and Cornfield Farm. There is then a gentle uphill section high above the valley back to our cars. This is a lovely walk with outstanding views all round.

Meet at St Andrew's car park for a 9.30am start and we should finish the walk by about 2.00/2.30pm. Bring refreshments for elevenses and lunch and suitable clothing for cold, hot and wet weather - it is the start of British summer after all!
